Lee R. Goldberg, MD, MPH, FACC is Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He is Chief of the Advanced Heart Failure and Transplant Section in the Division of Cardiovascular Medicine. He is Vice Chair of Medicine for Informatics at the University of Pennsylvania and in this role is responsible for the implementation and optimization of the electronic medical record as well as coordinating quality and operational data across the Department of Medicine. Dr. Goldberg is board certified (and re-re-certified) in Internal medicine, Cardiovascular Disease and Advanced Heart Failure and Cardiac Transplant.

He was the Principle Investigator of an AHRQ sponsored RO1 grant evaluating the impact of different technology models on heart failure disease management. He is currently a Co-PI of an NIH sponsored RO1 grant studying behavioral economics as part of heart failure remote monitoring. He is the Chair of the Member Section Steering Committee of the American College of Cardiology and also served as the past Chair of the Heart Failure and Cardiac Transplant Leadership Council. He is past Chair of the Heart Failure and Transplant Medicine Council of the International Society of Heart and Lung Transplantation. He is a past member of the Health Information Technology Task Force, Digital Steering Committee and Cardiovascular Management Council and is a

current member of the Lifelong Learning Committee of the American College of Cardiology. He is co-chair of the International Sessions for the ACC Annual Meeting Program Committee. He is a member of the AHA Get with the Guidelines Heart Failure Clinical Workgroup and is the lead for Get With The Guidelines Heart Failure China.

Dr. Goldberg earned his medical degree cum laude from Boston University School of Medicine. He completed an internal medicine internship and residency at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Goldberg continued his postgraduate medical education with a fellowship in cardiovascular disease at Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard University, followed by a fellowship in heart failure and cardiac transplantation at the same facility. He received his Master of Public Health Degree concentrating in Clinical Effectiveness from the Harvard University School of Public Health.

The author of numerous journal articles, abstracts and reviews, Dr. Goldberg's work has been published in Circulation, Circulation – Heart Failure, Journal of the American College of Cardiology, Lancet, Journal of Clinical Epidemiology, Cardiovascular Drugs and Therapy, American Journal of Cardiology, The Journal of Heart Lung Transplantation and The American Heart Journal. He is on the Editorial Board for JACC-Heart Failure serves as a reviewer for publications including The New England Journal of Medicine, Journal of the American College of Cardiology, European Journal of Cardiology, Annals of Internal Medicine, the Journal of Heart and Lung Transplantation, and the American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine.

Dr. Goldberg is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology, and a member of the American Heart Association, the International Society of Heart and Lung Transplantation and Heart Failure Society of America. He is a frequent invited lecturer on topics including health information technology, congestive heart failure, sleep apnea and heart failure, heart failure disease management and remote monitoring, ventricular assist devices and cardiac transplantation.

He previously served as the Director of the Cleveland Clinic Internal Medicine Residency Program's Scholarly Activity Program and the Medicine Humanities Program. He is a graduate of the Stanford Faculty Development Program in clinical teaching. He completed a term as member of the Cleveland Clinic's Board of Governors and has participated in or chaired many clinical/administrative and academic task forces at the Clinic.

Dr. Mandell has served on or chaired national education planning and writing committees for the American College of Rheumatology (ACR), the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American College of Physicians (ACP), including serving as chairman of the Annual Meeting Planning Committee for both the ACP and ACR. He served as Vice Chairman of the ACGME Internal Medicine Residency Review Committee (RRC) until 2019. He has served on the Editorial Board of several journals including Arthritis Care and Research, J Clin Rheumatology, and Arthritis and

Rheumatology. He is an Editor of the Merck Manual (rheumatology and immunology sections). He presents the annual workshop in synovial fluid analysis at the annual ACR scientific meeting and speaks nationally and internationally on a range of topics including gout, vasculitis, medical education and authorship.
